A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem.

And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

Amazed and astonished, they asked, ‘Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?’

And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language?

Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes,

Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.’

All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, ‘What does this mean?’

But others sneered and said, ‘They are filled with new wine.’

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: ‘Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.

Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning.

No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

“In the last days it will be, God declares,
that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,

and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

Even upon my slaves, both men and women,

in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.

And I will show portents in the heaven above

and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood,

before the coming of the Lord’s great and glorious day.

Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.” *Acts 2.1-21*

A Reading from The Letter to the Romans

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, ‘Abba! Father!’ it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. *Romans 8.14-17*

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Philip said to him, ‘Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, “Show us the Father”?’

Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it. 'If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you for ever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. *John 14.8-17*

For the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Pentecost Sunday – John 14:8-17, (25-27).

The above text from John occurs during the dinner conversation at the last supper when Jesus starts answering Philip then begins to address his beloved disciples. Jesus promises to send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit to indwell the disciples, to deepen their understanding of the Kingdom Way as taught and lived by Him and partake of Christ's resurrection life in mission and ministry. For John this is best expressed in the command to love one another as Jesus loved.

God's "coming" was not absent from the world before Pentecost however, this mystical, perhaps unexplainable event can be understood as a breakthrough in our human capacity to apprehend and experience God's presence in all of creation. At Pentecost they were gifted with an experience where walls of division and difference dissolved in the language of their common humanity. People of all nations speaking a myriad of languages experienced God's mighty and transformative presence. Barriers broken down, outsiders welcomed, the separated reconciled, all energized by the gift of the Holy Spirit. All invited to be agents of transformation.

When Jesus speaks of "greater works" is he perhaps speaking of our being part of the mystery of the Godhead by being given a member of that Godhead? The Holy Spirit to abide with us forever. How do we unpack this gift? Or consciously live in awareness of what has been given? This surely would inspire us to look for God's Spirit in places, people, situations, contexts where we have not looked before? Sinful, imperfect human beings is the place where His Spirit abides eternally. The world cannot receive him as the world is not looking for him. May our prayer be that Your Spirit whisper through every heart and place where your Presence is currently silent.

Preaching at Evensong in St Paul's Cathedral, Sale, during Reconciliation Week in 2013, Bishop John McIntyre said

There is an unhealed wound in the soul of this nation . . . Australian history is replete with examples of horrific injustice and even attempted genocide of our Indigenous peoples . . . In Gippsland massacres like that at Warrigal Creek were amongst the worst on the Australian mainland . . . For there to be reconciliation there must be repentance. Repentance is far more than saying sorry, and it took us until 2008 before we even [did that] . . . It is about living in a whole new way with each other . . . walking forward on a whole new path.

Let us 'be brave' and 'make change' so as to bring healing to the soul of our nation; and let us start at home, here in Gippsland, with a firm commitment to praying for, and resourcing, the priestly ministry exercised by our own two First Nations clergy.
