Trinity Sunday Reflection

Trinity is a mystery to be experienced in the journey of our Christian spiritual lives.

The 15th Century Icon by Russian painter Andrei Rublev, is an image of three angels visiting Abraham at the Oak of Mamre (Genesis 18:1-16) and widely interpreted as an icon of the Holy Trinity.



This icon is held in high esteem by Christians of the East and the West. At the time, the concept of the Trinity was thought of as an embodiment of spiritual unity, peace, harmony, mutual love and humility. We can stand before it and see our humanity drawn into its fellowship, individually and corporately, encouraged to participate in their loving communion. The Trinity refers to our living relationship with God the Father, God the Son, and God the holy Spirit. We are invited to live in it and by so doing, glimpse the incomparable beauty of the Godhead into which we have been baptized.

Many years ago, I attended a study day for clergy at St Albans Abbey, St Albans UK. The key note speaker was Bishop Kallistos Ware, Spalding Lecturer in Eastern Orthodox Studies at Oxford University, (he is now Metropolitan of Diokleia). Bishop Kallistos, introduced his address on the Trinity (which I remember as being very inspiring) with the following little story. Some centuries ago, a newly appointed Orthodox Bishop was making the ‘rounds’ of his diocese, travelling by boat because his diocese included part of the Aegean Sea. He came across a small remote island upon which lived three monks. The new bishop asked the monks what they understood about the Trinity? They said, “never heard of the Trinity!” Shocked, the Bishop spent all day with them teaching about the Trinity. In the evening the bishop and his retinue set sail for their next destination. In the early hours of the following morning, a crew member drew to the bishop’s attention to what looked like three men running across the water calling out, “Bishop”! They stopped their vessel and waited. It was the three monks hailing the bishop, wanting to speak with him. They said they were very distressed because they couldn’t

remember the Bishop's teaching on the Trinity. The bishop wide eyed asked, "how do you pray?" The monks looked at each other and smiled as they sung with arms outstretched "You are three and so are we". The bishop nodded, "return to your island, don't worry about what I said about the Trinity, just continue praying as you are doing. Trinity is a mystery to be experienced in Christian living.

This is a once-a-decade gathering of bishops from across the Anglican Communion which will meet in Canterbury, the United Kingdom, between 26 July – 8th August 2022. The theme is God's Church for God's World – Walking, Listening and Witnessing Together.

This event plays an influential role in the life of the Anglican Church and gathers together bishops and spouses for prayer, bible study, worship and fellowship and helps shape the life of the Anglican Communion for the next decade.

Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, has called on Anglicans around the Communion to pray for it. <https://www.lambethconference.org/> He asks us to pray that as we meet and consider our shared mission and ministry, that we may hear the call from God. In turn, that we might add our voices to call others to make a difference for Christ in the world.
