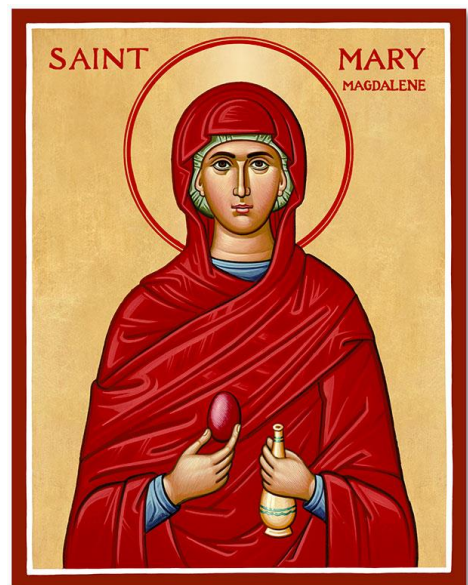

A Reading from the Second Letter to the Corinthians

For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for

Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. *2 Corinthians 5.14-21*

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, ‘They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.’ Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went towards the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus’ head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes. But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, ‘Woman, why are you weeping?’ She said to them, ‘They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him.’ When she had said this, she turned round and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, ‘Woman, why are you weeping? For whom are you looking?’ Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, ‘Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away.’ Jesus said to her, ‘Mary!’ She turned and said to him in Hebrew, ‘Rabbouni!’ (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, ‘Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, “I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.” ’ Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, ‘I have seen the Lord’; and she told them that he had said these things to her. *John 20.1-18*

What a raft of emotions was shown on that first wonderful Easter morning. Mary would have been inconsolable and utterly bewildered that her beloved Master had disappeared from the tomb.

Then the voice of the same beloved saying ‘Mary’, followed by his words ‘I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.’ How great her joy would have been and how great is our joy as we relive this precious, sacred and

wonderful morning.

What a tremendous honour too as Jesus told her to go and tell the apostles what had transpired – a woman being the first to carry this greatest of news. Praise the Lord!!

Chapter news – June and July

At the Chapter meeting in June, Dean Keren presented 12 disciplines from *A Celebration of Discipline* by Richard Foster.

News:

- Kilmany had a joyful celebration of St Alban's Day on Sunday 18th June.
- Loch Sport is down to 1 or 2 people at services and the Catholic and Anglican leaders are discussing ways forward, including possible ecumenical prayer services.
- Following on from the Parish Visioning Day, Hymn Lovers started on Sunday 11th June and is going well. A Back to Church Sunday is being planned for later in the year.
- Chapter is developing plans and practices for safe ministry at the Cathedral, with reference to the Safe Ministry Authority material. We are currently working on the first Child Safe Standard, to create a culturally safe environment so that those from diverse identities are respected and valued.

Donations for Cathedral solar now tax deductible

St Paul's Cathedral is currently seeking donations for the rooftop solar system which was installed in January. The Sustainability Victoria grant covered about half the cost.

We still have a shortfall of about \$3000 to replenish Cathedral funds, which were used on a temporary basis to pay the remainder. When the decision to install the panels was made, Chapter made a commitment not to use Cathedral funds, but to seek donations to pay for the half that our grant did not cover. Can you help?
