Hear what the Lord says:

Rise, plead your case before the mountains,
and let the hills hear your voice.

Hear, you mountains, the controversy of the Lord ,
and you enduring foundations of the earth;

A Reading from The First Letter to the Corinthians

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

For it is written,

‘I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,
and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart.’

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?

For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe.

For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom,
but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling-block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles,

but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

For God’s foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God’s weakness is stronger than human strength.

Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth.

But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is

weak in the world to shame the strong;

God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are,

so that no one might boast in the presence of God.

He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption,

in order that, as it is written, ‘Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.’

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: ‘Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ‘Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. ‘Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. ‘Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. ‘Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. ‘Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. ‘Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. ‘Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ‘Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. *Matthew 5.1-12*

For the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Dean’s Reflection

He has told you, O mortal, what is good;

and what does the Lord require of you

but to do justice, and to love kindness,

and to walk humbly with your God?

I hope that this verse is inscribed in the hearts of all of us here in the Cathedral parish and beyond. One commentator calls this “biblical ethics in a nutshell” – and I think that’s pretty accurate. What does God want us to do? To do justice, to be kind, to walk humbly with God. This verse from Micah gives good content to the “two great commandments”: Love God with all that you are and have, and love your neighbour as you love yourself. We learn that loving God is about walking humbly with God, and loving our neighbour is about yearning to see justice done for all, and treating others with kindness.

The Hebrew word often translated “humbly” (or “reverently”), signifies suggests that “walking with” God includes a mindfulness of God’s attentions and works (verses 3–5), and of the affirmation that one bears responsibility for one’s actions in

life. More than just “biblical ethics”, this passage hints that how we act for and with one another reflects our relationship with God.

In fact, to love our neighbour as we love ourselves is to love God; to be kind and to seek justice – this is what God is like. And walking humbly with God says something about God’s own humility; it would not be required of us if God was not the sort to come to us in human flesh and to tabernacle among us.

If you are not familiar with this verse, it’s worth memorising it, writing it down and pasting it beside your bathroom mirror or on a cupboard door so you can see it every day, and so that it can inspire you to strive throughout the day for the cause of justice, to be kind without fail to those you interact with and meet, and to hold God’s presence in mind humbly and reverently.

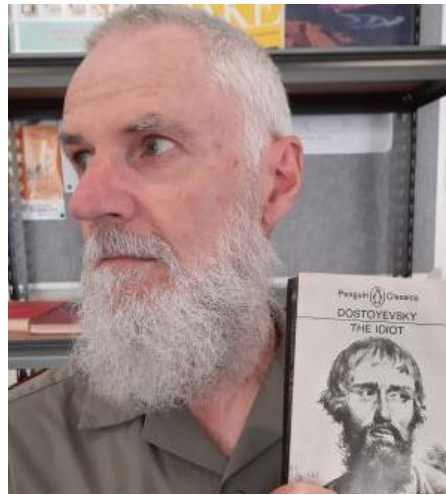
