A Reading from the Book of Malachi

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years. Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts. For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, have not perished. Ever since the days of your ancestors you have turned aside from my statutes and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you, says the Lord of hosts. But you say, 'How shall we return?' Will anyone rob God? Yet you are robbing me! But you say, 'How are we robbing you?' In your tithes and offerings! You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me—the whole nation of you! Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing. I will rebuke the locust for you, so that it will not destroy the produce of your soil; and your vine in the field

shall not be barren, says the Lord of hosts. Then all nations will count you happy, for you will be a land of delight, says the Lord of hosts. You have spoken harsh words against me, says the Lord. Yet you say, 'How have we spoken against you?' You have said, 'It is vain to serve God. What do we profit by keeping his command or by going about as mourners before the Lord of hosts? *Malachi 3.1-14* Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Advent 2 Biblical Reflection – from the Christmas Bowl resources BIBLICAL REFLECTION

The Christian community in Gaza is one of the oldest in church history and is sadly now facing the very real threat of annihilation. Since October 2023, the Monastery of St. Porphyrios became a place

of refuge for hundreds of people, regardless of their religion.

Their priest, Archbishop Alexios, pledged "As long as there is at least one Christian in the territory of Gaza, I will not go anywhere, because I can be a hope for them".

"Where are we to go when no place is safe?" is the repeated plea as families flee from one area to another in the tiny Gaza Strip. Even areas designated by Israel as 'humanitarian safe zones' have come under violent bombing leaving thousands dead or wounded, searching for their loved ones under the rubble. Life for Palestinians in the occupied West Bank has also seen increased food and water insecurity, forced displacement and home demolitions. Their land is confiscated to build illegal Israeli Settlements with the place of Jesus' birth sadly being erased.

In these weeks leading up to Christmas Day, Bethlehem will no doubt be spoken of from every church pulpit the world over as people commemorate its significance in our salvation story. This year, the invitation is for us to not just talk about Bethlehem as it relates to the Biblical narrative, but for us to grapple with the life infants are born into in current day Bethlehem, Gaza and throughout the West Bank. Our Christian siblings in the Holy Land are crying out to be heard, listen to their cries.
