Advent 4 Biblical Reflection – from the Christmas Bowl resources Our primary hope and joy as Christians comes from the fact that Jesus Christ gave himself for us. Jesus liberates us from our sin and makes us holy (Hebrews 10:10). In him we find security and peace (Micah 5: 4 & 5). Like Mary, we learn that God has looked with favour upon us

(Luke 1:48).

As Christians, we know that we do not need to spend our lives trying to earn a reward from God. God does not need sacrifices and offerings from us. They give him no pleasure (Hebrews 10:6). God's love has been fully extended towards us with all creation and for all time. Jesus assures of this.

Our lives change when we glimpse the breadth of God's love for us. We discover that we are no longer lowly but blessed. Our hearts and souls fill with joy. We offer praise with our lips and with our lives.

One of the experiences of being loved is the desire to share that love with others. We want the best for them. Christians devote themselves to works of justice, mercy, and care not for reward but to serve. This work is an expression of love.

The same is true for the choices Christians make about their money. They give generously to make a positive difference in the world. Many people have chosen the Christmas Bowl for 75 years as their way of demonstrating God's love for refugees and people in need at Christmas.

Today, we are invited to celebrate God's love for us in Jesus.

To look forward to living more fully in him and to find ways of expressing our joy in that love wherever we may be. *Dr Peter Stuart*

One of the things I'm sometimes conscious of at funerals is that most of us only know one another by snapshot: at a funeral we hear more about the different dimensions that make up someone's life. Stan had a long and active ministry as a lay reader, member of synod, member of chapter, member of Bishop in Council, and much more. We commend both him and Bob into God's keeping, and pray for angels to surround their loved ones, especially at this time.

I hope you can stay after the morning service when we'll be having a **congregational chat.** Bring along your ideas and questions - it'll be an opportunity to air any concerns and propose suggestions.

Today (Sunday) at 5pm we will be holding a Blue Christmas service for others who may be grieving or finding this time of year difficult. I'll be playing the harp - it'll be a lovely, gentle opportunity to reflect, remember, and know the presence and comfort of the God who loves us.

I'm conscious that many folk will be away this week over Christmas, spending time with friends and family. I pray that wherever you'll be and whatever you'll be doing, it will be joyous and full of the peace that only the presence of God-with-us brings, the peace that passes all understanding.




