The ministry and JOY of the Book Fair comes in all shapes and sizes.



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CHALKING OF THE CHURCH

Our help is in the name of The Lord

$$20 + C + M + B + 25$$

The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and twenty-four years ago. May Christ bless those who worship and minister in this Church and remain with them throughout the new year.
