#### Dean's Desk

This week I've been reflecting on answered prayer and the blessings of thankfulness that come when our feet are on the path God lays out for us. I've been thinking about this particularly in relation to the prayer for the year of Hope which is on the front of the pew sheet, and taking the time to notice when I pray the extent to which I believe God's promise to hear and answer prayer.

This week I've been beginning to put in place some of the things I've been working towards. The first of these is inviting anyone who's interested to join me and a bunch of other people from our congregations in preparing intercessions for our worship services. We've largely been using Janet Nelson's Let Us Pray (1995) most weeks, and it's time to have a greater diversity of local voices leading our corporate prayers. If you're interested in this, please talk to me; I'll be running a training session some time in February, and can provide a bunch of different examples to work from.

I'm also starting from today to record our Hope snippets! The idea is that we'll play one or maybe two of these short videos each week during the notices through Lent

and Easter (and maybe beyond), as a way of encouraging hope in our midst. There's also the possibility of posting them on the parish youtube channel, the diocesan webpage for Hope25, and the national Hope25 youtube channel, if participants are willing.

I'll be inviting participants to answer one (or two) of these questions: What hope does Jesus give you? How does faith in Jesus give you hope? What hope does faith in Jesus offer to others (the world, etc)? Each video will be about 2min - about 200-300 words.

A team member also ran over the road to rescue a lady's lunch from her car during the thunderstorm, so she could eat it waiting for the rain to stop. She was sooo appreciative. As Keren commented, we are doing so much 'ministry' to the wider community, and our every action and conversation is observed and shared around the place. Even spider and cockroach removal services,

magpie hydration provision, downlight replacements and daily floor cleaning (thanks Michael) are handled (discretely) with care, as is caring for all the workers. Steph and Nancy ensure we are fed and watered hourly; this week it included special birthday cake, donuts, pizzas and a local shop donated pies and biscuits. The usual comments about the quality and quantity of the books, the way is it so lovingly set up and has signs etc. flood in. By day 15 we had made more sales than 22 days of last year, but that can include buying one raffle ticket!! However, we do have a HUGE day on Wednesday to sort, pack and move all the leftover books. All helpers (non church people welcome) will be fed, and we start at 9am. If you have not been, please come, and if nothing else, sit and watch the amazing team at work and most importantly, **please thank all workers** for the hours and effort they are putting in on behalf of You, God and St Pauls. *Christine*
